Uneven walking surfaces	All participants	Low/	Advise participants to exercise care. Less mobile participants may wish to use a walking stick or pole.	Some paths may have tree roots beneath the surface.
Muddy conditions	All participants	Low	Avoid boggy areas if conditions are wet.	Monitor weather forecast and make use of local information about conditions. Most of the heath is likely to be dry in the summer.

Steep slopes	All participants	Low	Ask for assistance or pause for a rest if needed.	The regular route is mostly flat, but there is a slope from the car park.
Trip hazards	All participants	Low	Advise participants to take care.	Some paths may be uneven with tree roots beneath the path.
Stiles and gates	Less mobile participants	Low	Participants should ask for assistance with opening/closing gates as required.	There are no stiles.
Obstructive vegetation and Stinging or thorny plants	All participants	Low/medium	Participants should exercise care and wear suitable footwear and long trousers to protect against scratching, biting insects and the possibility of ticks.	Gorse or heather may occasionally encroach on the route.

Biting insects	All participants	Low/medium	Participants to wear suitable footwear and clothing. Also to consider use of insect repellent.	Seasonal, but likely to be active on summer evening walks.
