**Location:** Castle Hill Nature Reserve - (East Brighton)

Meet in the car park at the top of Falmer Road (near the junction with The Drove). If approaching from A27/ Falmer, the car park is on the left, just before Bexhill Road (B2123)

**Walk:** The walk to the site is along a good path, but is uneven in parts. At the site we will be negotiating fairly steep sided valleys. Good strong boots and walking poles if required.

Clothing: Participants to check the weather forecast and to dress for the prevailing conditions. The site is open and lacking much shade.

**Facilities:** A reasonably spacious car park, unpaved. You will need to bring lunch and a drink as there are no amenities or facilities in this location.

**Reptiles:** Adders are present. They normally disappear before we can approach. However on cooler days they may be sluggish and should be treated with caution.
