Risk Assessment highlight; The turning into the beach car park entrance road can flood when wet, take care with hidden potholes. The walk involves walking on raised sea walls, care needed when wet, suitable clothing and winter walking boots required.

The second part of the walk we will be walking along the edge of tidal beaches, shingle and some sand. Broadly speaking a low risk walk but open and exposed to the elements.

Suggested clothing: Warm, waterproof clothing depending on weather conditions; strong footwear or wellington boots after rain.
